SUBJECT / TEAM

EVANGELIZATION AND SPIRITUAL FORMATION TEAM

(I) Aims

- 1. To uphold and pass on the values of Catholic Schools (especially 5 core values: Truth, Justice, Love, Life & Family) to students to prepare them properly for their life and future responsibilities.
- 2. To cultivate religion, moral values and compassion and to provide a family environment imbued with mutual trust and love.
- 3. To foster Catholic faith of the Catholics of the Educative Pastoral Community and deepen spiritual life through religious activities.
- 4. To create opportunities for teachers and students to have deeper understanding about Catholic traditions and to enrich their spiritual temperament.
- 5. To raise the awareness of spiritual formation.
- 6. To vision, discern, plan and explore, create and implement opportunities for spiritual education, training and formation for spiritual growth inviting Educative Pastoral Community to participate on the journey and to view Jesus as the perfect role mode to follow.
- 7. To open the hearts of Educative Pastoral Community to a deeper connection with God.

(II) Situational Analysis

(a) Strengths

- 1. We have good tradition which is well developed by the Salesians.
- 2. The religious atmosphere in the campus is strong.
- 3. Teachers in the Evangelization and Spiritual Formation Team are passionate to carry out their duties.

(b) Weakness

- 1. Teachers of the Evangelization and Spiritual Formation Team have heavy workload in different aspects.
- 2. The collaboration between the Religious Education Team and St. Anthony's Church still need to be strengthen.
- 3. Some teachers misunderstand the importance and definition of Religious Education.
- 4. Students are not interested in religious activities nor Spiritual Formation.

(c) Opportunities

- 1. There are over 30 Salesian Youth Catholic Society committee members, which are divided into 4 sodalities. They can help in various activities of Evangelization and Spiritual Formation Team and Salesian Youth Catholic Society.
- 2. The Hong Kong Diocese has various commissions and strong resources to support the school for Evangelization and Spiritual Formation.

(d) Threats

- 1. There is no Salesian, who acts as teaching staff, in our school. This may affect the practice of the Salesian Spirit in our School.
- 2. The identity of "Salesian Youth" is weak among St. Louis students.
- 3. Supplementary tutoring making people put too much emphasis on academic results but not all-round development and especially in spiritual formation.
- 4. Temptations and obsession with electronic devices causing students not willing to stay after school.
